Guide Your Heart

1. Many Jews have arrived in Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. Look up the following scriptures and note your findings on each ceremony.

Exodus 12:21-28 - THE PASSOVER

Deuteronomy 16:3 - THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD

2. How does the OT tradition of the Passover lamb point to Christ?
3. What interesting situation took place immediately following the first Lord's supper?

What does this tell you about man's nature?

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How does Jesus instruct our conduct as disciples? **Luke 22:26, Philippians 2:1-8**

What are some subtle ways you might begin to strive after a position or title in an unhealthy way?

4. What do we learn about Satan's authority in **Luke 22:31**? See **Job 7:1-12** for additional support.

Using a dictionary or online resource. How did a farmer sift wheat in bible times?

What does Jesus mean, "Simon, Simon, look out. Satan has asked to sift you like wheat."?

According to **Romans 8:34**, Jesus sits at the right hand of God and intercedes for us. How does this encourage you?

5. Describe the scene in Gethsemane in **Luke 22:39-46**. What details stand out to you?

What made Christ's experience in Gethsemane so excruciating?

6. What lessons do we learn about prayer and temptation in **Luke 22:39-46**? Look up the following verses and note your findings for additional support.

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Ephesians 6:18

Luke 17:1

1 Corinthians 10:13

Matthew 26:41

How would you describe your prayer life: alert or asleep?

Where in your life would Satan like you to be sleeping and not praying?

7. What painful details about Peter's denial does Luke include that the other gospels leave out? (see **Matt. 26:57-58, 69-75; Mark 14:53-54, 66-72, and John 18:15-18, 25-27**)

Is there a danger in saying, "I would never do that!"? Why or Why not?

8. Why does Jesus now instruct His disciples to take a money-bag and buy a sword in **Luke 22:36**?

Are there ways you expect or demand to be treated better than Jesus was by the world? An unsaved relative? An unsaved employer?

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What would change in your life and your joy if you did not expect this?

9. In Luke's crucifixion account (**Luke 23:26-46**), what does Jesus say and do? List His actions.

Read **Hebrews 12:1-4**. How will you find comfort in your own difficulties from knowing that Jesus has faced worse, and yet remained truthful and loyal?
